

Welcome to 1000 Islands Environmental Center

Established in 1969, 1000 Islands is a 350 acre conservancy zone along the lower Fox River. There are over seven miles of trails including barrier-free boardwalk. The Nature Center building houses live animals, educational exhibits and animal mounts.

The Nature Center and trail system are open to school and community groups along with the general public. Fees are only required for programming with a naturalist.
